Agenda Item 1: Roll Call, Ms. Green was absent.

Agenda Item 4: Request for Crosswalk on Morgan Drive at Stadium Drive

Ms. Linda Csont, 70 Standish Blvd., stated that she was frustrated that nothing has been done regarding this request. She stated she requested this in November and has followed up with Manager McGill and she is disappointed that the PTA was not advised on the status. Ms. Csont stated that this is a pedestrian issue, not a traffic pattern problem. She also requested that the draft meeting minutes be made available to the public prior to the meeting for public input.

Ms. Bonnie Dougherty, 271 Hazel Drive stated that the problem is the crosswalk, not a traffic flow issue. The crosswalk is currently only half way across the roadway.

Mr. Brown stated that after discussion with Municipal staff it was determined that this location will be reviewed once Horsman Drive is reopened and there is a normal traffic pattern. Horsman Drive is scheduled to be reopened in May and will be reviewed at this time and findings will be presented at the June meeting.

A motion was made to request that Public Works repaint the current crosswalk. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 5: Request for Resident Only Parking on McCully Street

Ms. Joanne Bellia, 321 McCully Street requested resident parking permits on McCully Street due to the increase in vehicles parking on the street to avoid paying for parking on Beverly Road. She stated that the parking study that was currently conducted did not take residents into account and felt it is based on convenience of business district.

Board members discussed the fact that a study was already completed and recommendations were already submitted to Commissioners for their review and approval.

A motion was made to recommend that Commissioners consider recommendation #7 under the Proposed Concepts and Strategies on the parking study that was conducted by Environmental Planning & Design, Inc. Motion was passed 5 to 1 with Mr. Clark voting against.
