

MT. LEBANON TRAFFIC BOARD

Meeting Date: February 7, 2018

Mr. Fitzgerald opened the meeting.

Agenda Item 1: Roll Call,

Agenda Item 2: Opening Remarks from Chair

Agenda Item 3: Meeting Notes from January 3, 2018

Motion was made to approve the minutes from the January 3, 2018 meeting. Motion was approved and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

Agenda Item 4: Request for Stop Sign at Intersection of Valleyview Road and Couch Farm Road.

Mr. Haberman stated a site visit was conducted at the intersection of Valleyview Road and Couch Farm Road to review the sight distance and existing traffic control. Mr. Haberman stated there is limited sight distance and recommended that stop signs be installed on northbound Couch Farm Road approach to Valleyview and on the westbound Valleyview approach to Couch Farm. Mr. Haberman also recommended that vegetation in the landscaped island be no more than 3 feet above the roadway.

Mr. Clark made a motion to install the stop signs as recommended by Gateway and limit the vegetation in the landscaped traffic island to 3 feet above the roadway. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously. Board members requested that letters be sent to residents in the area to attend the March meeting to address any concerns or questions they may have on the recommendation.

Agenda Item 5: Review of No Parking Signs Installed on Main Entrance Drive and Lebanon Hills Drive.

Mr. Haberman stated that the signs on Main Entrance Drive and Lebanon Hills Drive were installed on a temporary basis to be reviewed in 6 months. Commissioners requested that letters be sent to residents requesting they attend this meeting to address their concerns regarding the signs.

Mr. Bill Ferrari, 20 Lebanon Hills presented pictures from before and after the installation on the parking restrictions. He spoke in favor of keeping the signs.

Mr. Sean Martin, 115 Main Entrance Drive spoke in favor of the parking restrictions.

Mr. James Cannon, 145 Main Entrance Drive spoke in favor of the parking restrictions.

Ms. Amy Pople, 217 Outlook Drive spoke in favor of the parking restrictions, but stated the drop off traffic is still an issue.

Ms. Kim Sampson, 8 Lebanon Hills Drive spoke in favor of the parking restrictions.

Mr. Bill Lankford, 211 Outlook Drive spoke in favor of the parking restrictions.

Mr. Chris Schultz, 200 Outlook Drive spoke in favor of the parking restrictions.

New Business:

Agenda Item 6: Items from the Floor

Commissioner McLean stated he is the new Commission Liaison to the Traffic Board. Commissioner McLean asked Mr. Haberman if a study was completed on Valleyview to warrant the recommendation of stop signs. Mr. Haberman stated that counts were not needed due to the sight distance being deficient enough to warrant the installation of the stop signs. Mr. McLean stated that a study was done at the intersection of Hoodrige and Rockwood and did not warrant the installation of stop signs. He stated he would like to have stop signs and crosswalks installed along with pedestrian stanchions in the crosswalks, and requested to have this placed on the March agenda.
