

MT. LEBANON TRAFFIC BOARD

Meeting Date: February 5, 2020

Members Present: Mr. Glock, Mr. Sloan, Mr. Waine, Ms. Krieger, and Mr. Whitehead

Mr. Waine opened the meeting.

Agenda Item 1: Roll Call, Mr. Glock and Mr. Sloan were absent.

Agenda Item 2: Opening Remarks from Chair

Agenda Item 3: Meeting Notes from January 8, 2020.

Motion was made to approve the minutes from the January 8, 2020 meeting. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Old Business:

Agenda Item 4: Request for Traffic Study on Marlin Drive East.

Mr. Haberman stated that Mt. Lebanon Police collected data on the 100 block of Marlin Drive East and the data collected did not meet the criteria for further traffic study. Mr. Haberman stated that this area may be included in the Arden Road study. No further action was taken.

Agenda Item 5: Request for Pedestrian Safety Improvements on Robb Hollow at the Intersection with Sylvandell and Driftwood.

Mr. Haberman stated that a motion was made to approve the improvements on Robb Hollow Road at the intersection with Syvandell and Driftwood and letters were sent to residents inviting them to attend this meeting to voice any concerns they may have. No one was in attendance. The motion made at the January meeting stands. No further action.

New Business:

Agenda Item 6: Request for Private Road Signage at Entrance to Alleyway Behind Serpentine Drive.

Mr. Jessies Heilman, 396 Serpentine Drive stated that the Municipality required the residents on Serpentine to pave the alleyway between Cochran Road and Carnegie Drive. Mr. Heilman stated that since the paving has been done people are now using it as a cut through causing damage to the pavement. Mr. Heilman is requesting No Trespassing / Private Property signs be installed by the Municipality. Board members advised the signs would need to be place on private property and it this policy of the Board and Municipality to not get involved with private property or driveways on this matter. Mr. Heilman asked if drivers could be sited for trespassing if signs were installed. Lt. Rayburg stated they could be cited. No further action was taken.

Agenda Item 7: Request for Audible Signal at Traffic Light on Cochran Road at Cedar Blvd.

Mr. Haberman stated that a request was received for an Audible Signal at the Traffic Light on Cochran Road at Cedar Blvd. A motion was made to approve the installation of an audible signal at the Traffic Light on Cochran Road at Cedar Blvd. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 8: Request for Left Turn Arrow onto Woodhaven Road at Traffic Signal on Washington Road.

Commissioner Steve Silverman spoke for a resident in his Ward regarding a request for a left turn arrow on the northbound traffic signal on Washington Road at Woodhaven. A motion was made to request Gateway review the traffic signal and intersection. Mr. Haberman will present his findings at the March meeting.

Agenda Item 9: Request for Parking Restriction on Clokey Avenue Near Bower Hill Road.

Mr. Dennis Swanson, 417 Clokey Avenue stated vehicles park close to the intersection of Clokey Avenue and Bower Hill Road making it difficult to see on coming traffic when turning onto Clokey from Bower Hill. He requested No Parking signs at the top of Clokey Avenue near Bower Hill Road. A Motion was made for Mr. Haberman to view the intersection. Mr. Haberman will present his findings at the March meeting.

Agenda Item 10: Request for Three Way Stop at the Intersection of Seneca Drive and Purchase Place.

Ms. Rebecca Muzika, 57 Seneca Drive spoke regarding concerns at the intersection of Seneca Drive and Purchase Place. Ms. Muzika lives at the intersection and a retaining wall in her yard was struck by a vehicle in the past and she is concerned for the safety of children walking to school and people taking walks in the area. Ms. Muzika requested stop signs be installed on Seneca Drive in both directions making the intersection a three way stop. Mr. Haberman advised that stop signs could not be installed for traffic calming and the intersection must meet the criteria for the installation of stop signs. A motion was made to request Mr. Haberman conduct a study of the intersection. Motion was seconded and passed unanimously. Mr. Haberman will present his findings at the March meeting.

Agenda Item 11: Items from the Floor.

Mr. Scott Zasadil, 126 Adacemy Avenue spoke regarding people parking on Academy Avenue for extended periods of time in the 3 Hour parking area. Lt. Rayburg stated that the Municipality does not currently have license plate readers for enforcement of parking violations. Commissioner Silverman stated that a parking study is being done and license plate readers are part of the study.

Mr. Carmine Bellini requested an update on items he brought to the board in December. Board members advised no one was present in January so no action was taken. Board members advised the requests will be placed on the agenda in March.

No additional items. Meeting adjourned at 7:45pm.
